November 3, 1935 - September 27, 2021



Elizabeth Sieg passed away peacefully at her home in Powell River, BC on September 27, 2021 at the age of 85 after a battle with pancreatic cancer.

They enjoyed their little piece of the Sunshine Coast.

Elizabeth enjoyed attending services at the Evangel Pentecostal Church. She was an avid gardener, energetic walker, loyal friend to those closest to her and a

wonderful mother, grandmother and great-grandmother to her whole family, never missing an important event with all the children and young adults alike.
